PROHIBITION-ERA ALCOHOL PRESCRIPTION FORM

This prop is a replica of an actual vintage government form.

Print on ordinary white paper.

Hand-write appropriate information on form.

During prohibition, one of the only legal ways of obtaining liquor was to get a doctor's prescription, which usually authorized booze one pint at a time. Forms of this type were usually filled out in longhand. A rubber stamped date and/or pharmacist's permit number would add to the authenticity of the prop.

Perforate, if possible, along dotted line along left side. **Trim** other sides along solid black crop marks.

Tear blank along perforated left edge, as if the form had been torn from a large pad.

Take prescription to your local "pharmacist" and enjoy!
