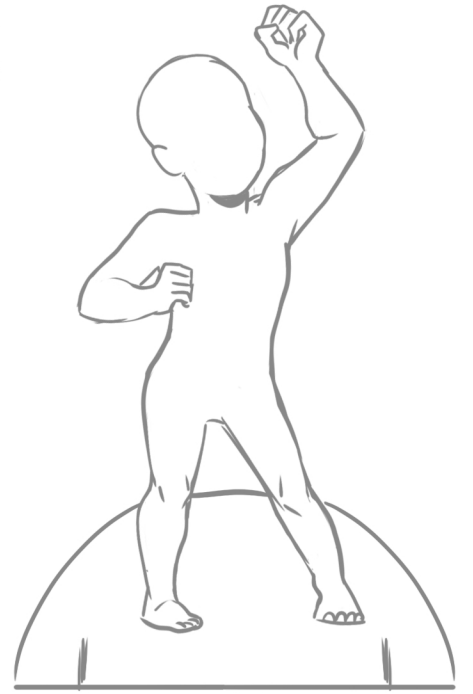


# PAPER SMALLS

1 - Print out on cardstock or have cardboard on hand to glue stick base too.

2 - Draw on hair, facial features.

3 - Cut base out and cut the two notches labeled B.

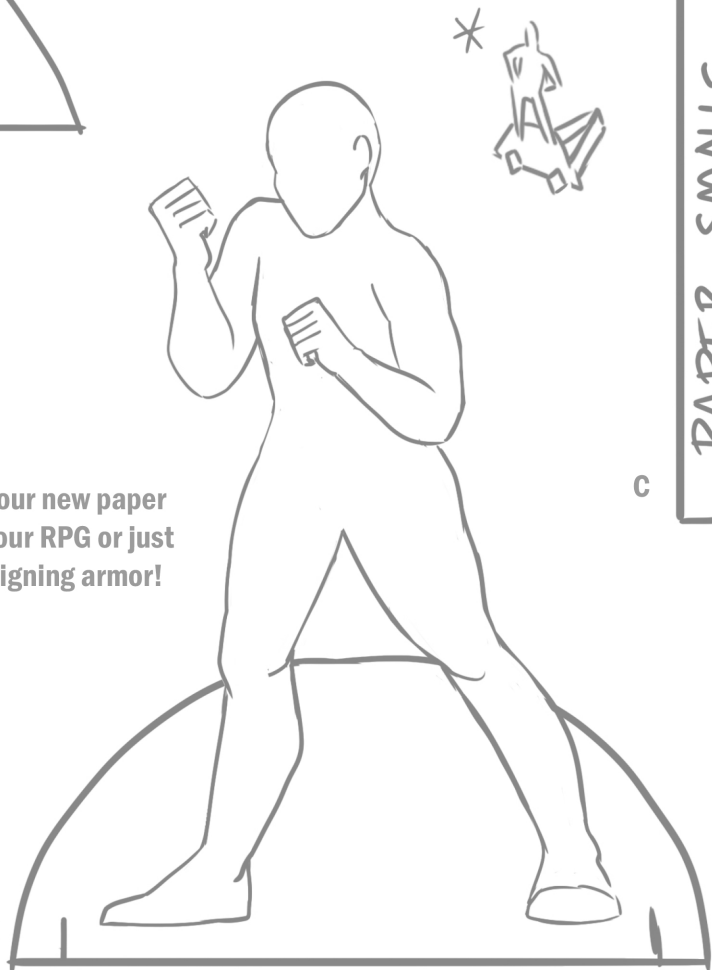
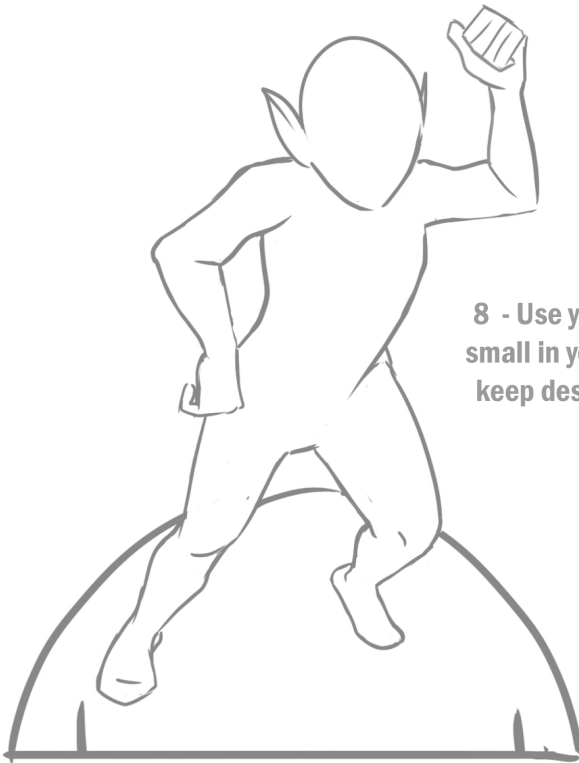
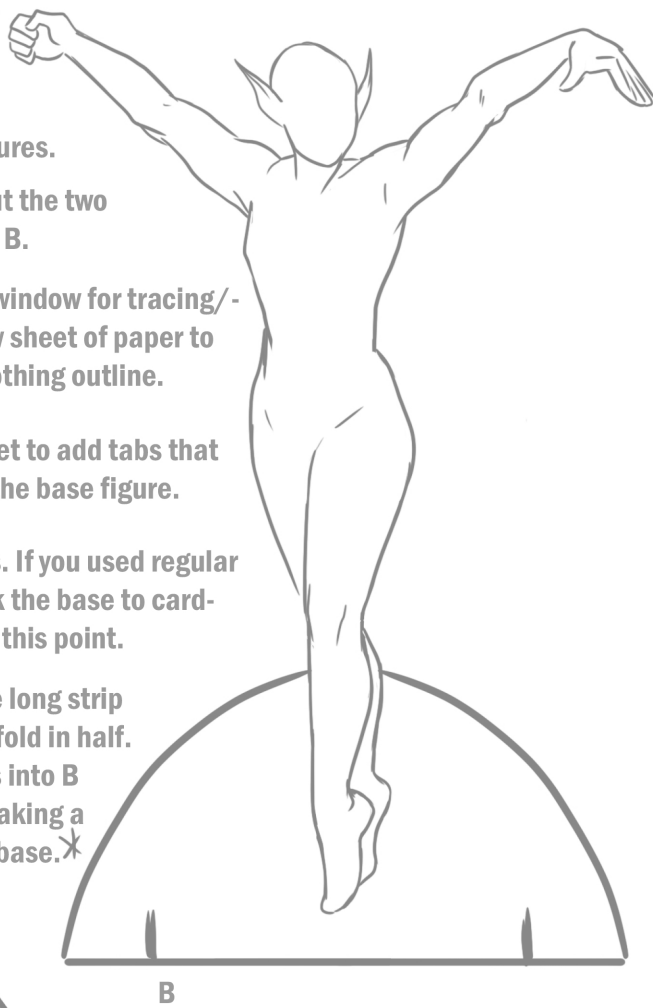
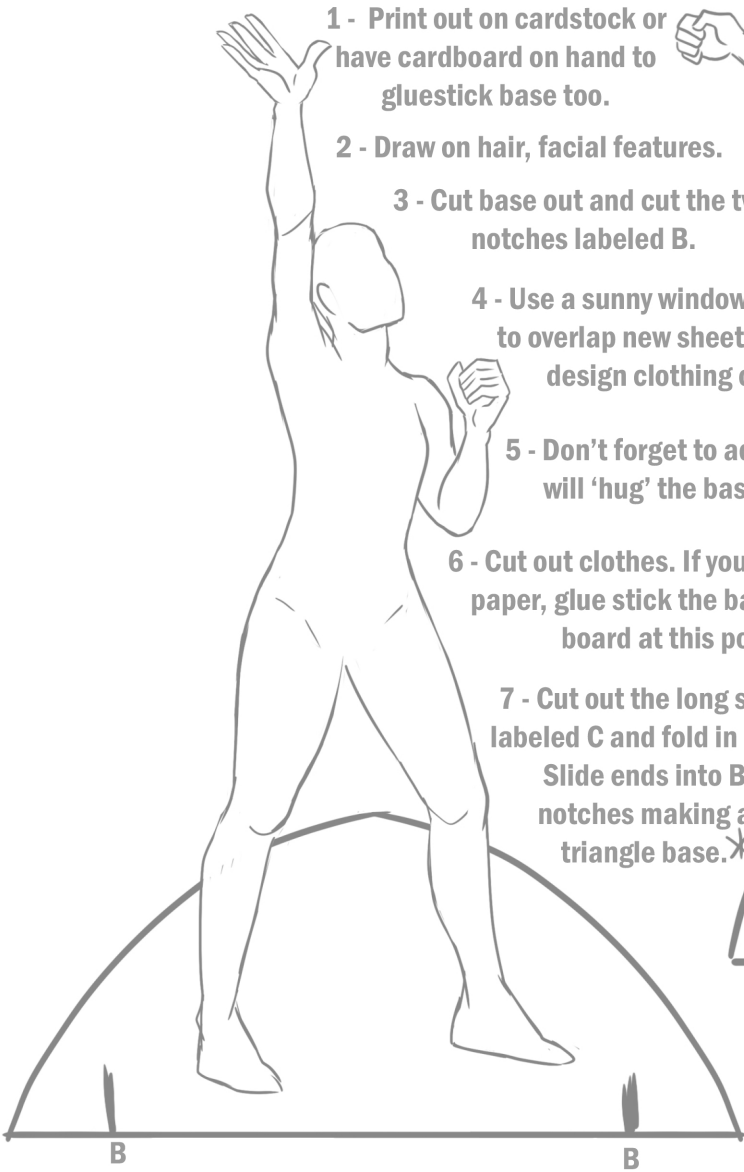
4 - Use a sunny window for tracing/- to overlap new sheet of paper to design clothing outline.

5 - Don't forget to add tabs that will 'hug' the base figure.

6 - Cut out clothes. If you used regular paper, glue stick the base to cardboard at this point.

7 - Cut out the long strip labeled C and fold in half.

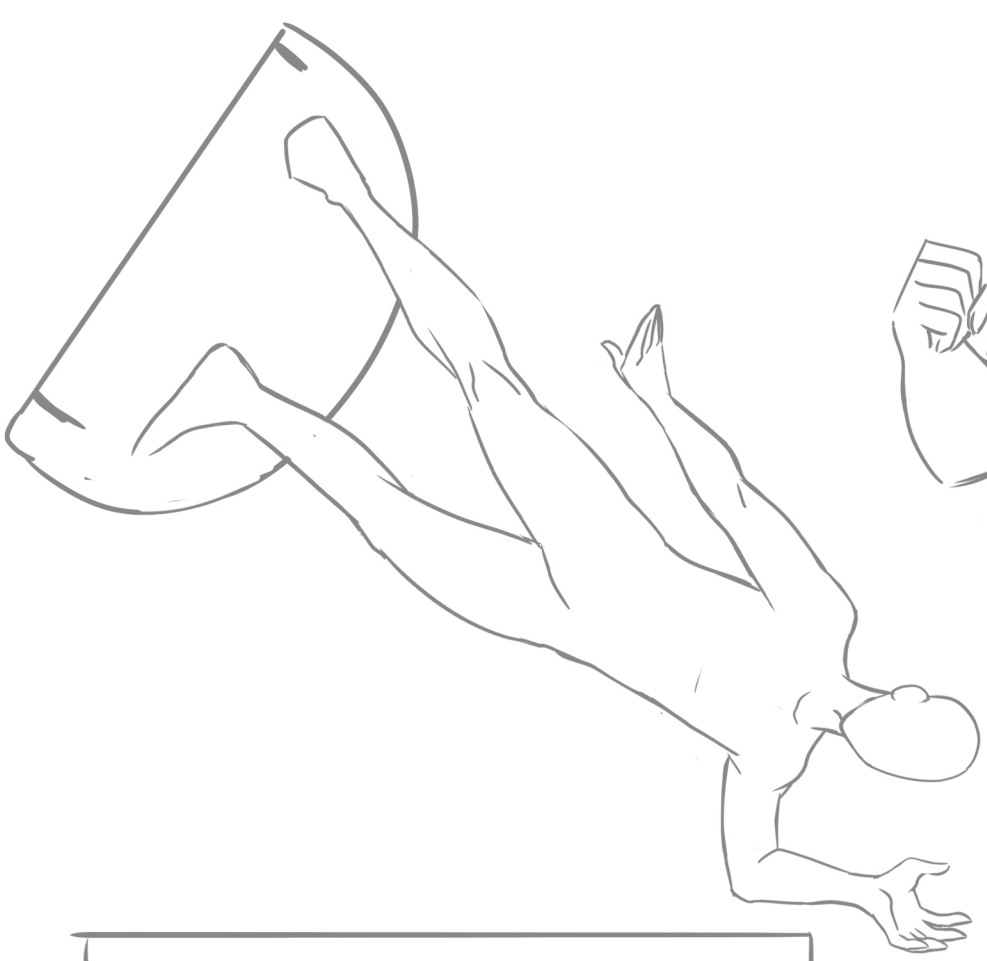
Slide ends into B notches making a triangle base.\*

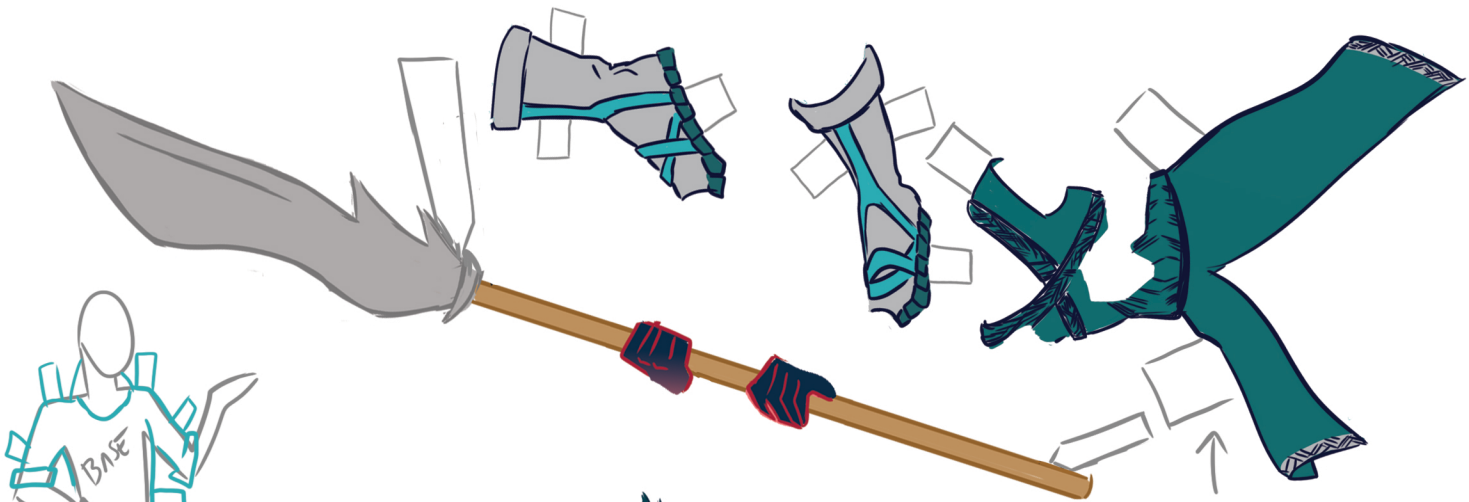


8 - Use your new paper small in your RPG or just keep designing armor!

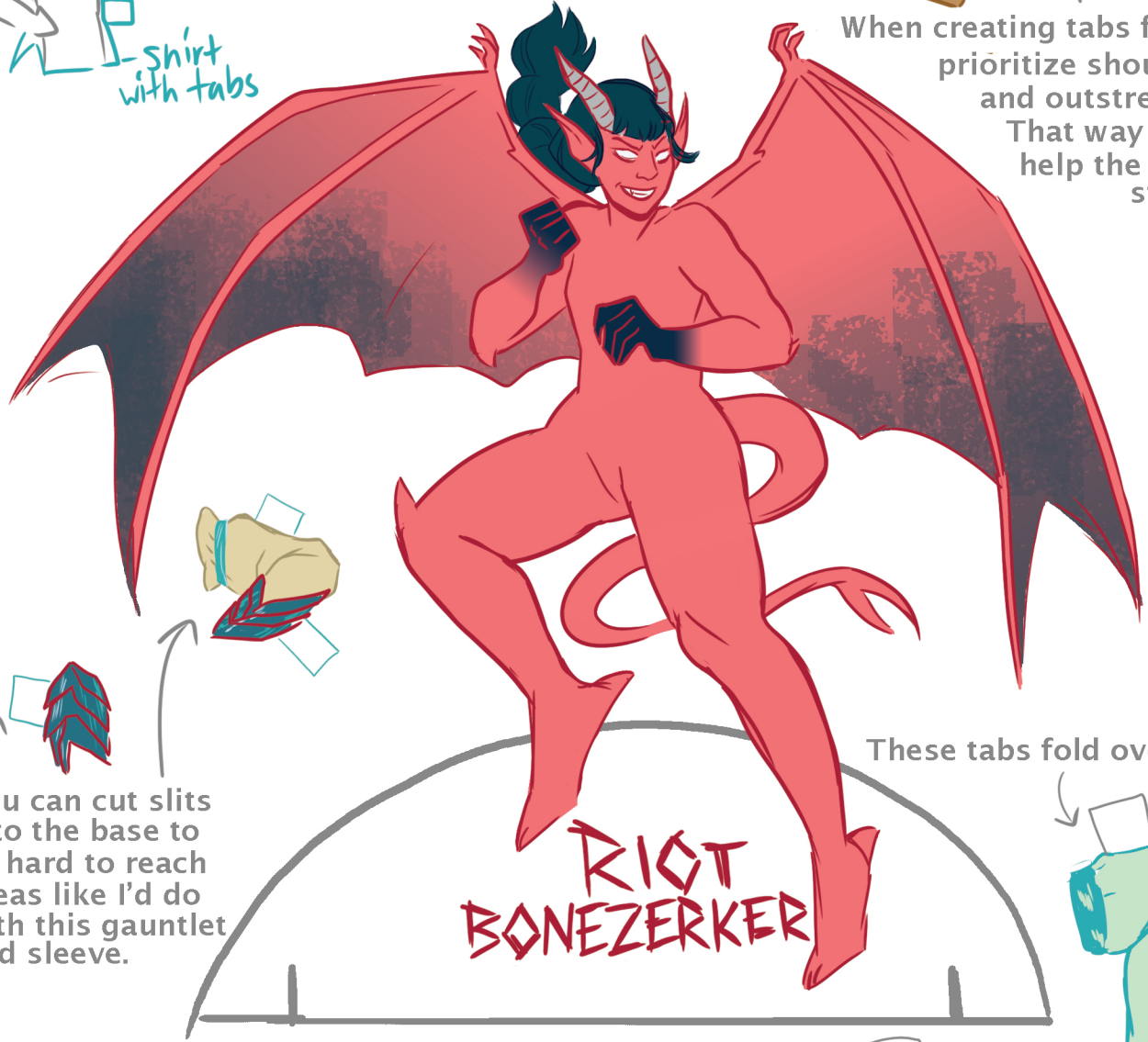

BASE  
-shirt with tabs

When creating tabs for clothing, prioritize shoulders, hips, and outstretched arms. That way gravity will help the folded tabs stay in place.

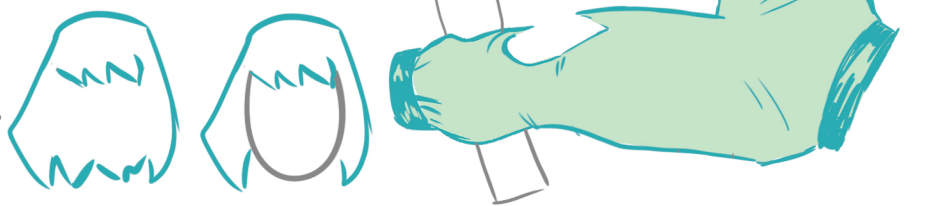


These tabs fold over the base.

You can cut slits into the base to fit hard to reach areas like I'd do with this gauntlet and sleeve.
