For three players...

- * Family: "Unspoken relationship"; former master and slave
- * Romance: Secret lovers
- * Crime: Blackmailer and victim

For four players, add...

- * Friendship: Lifelong friends, long separated

For five players, add...

- * Work: Doctor and patient

NEEDS AFTER THE WAR

For three players...

- * To get even: With a rival

For four or five players, add...

- * To get out: Of this dangerous relationship

LOCATIONS AFTER THE WAR

For three, four or five players...

- * Richmond: The Kanawha Canal

OBJECTS AFTER THE WAR

For three or four players...

- * Valuable: Deed to Lionel Thibodeaux's plantation

For five players, add...

- * Weapon: A fire-hardened pointed stick
