The "Lightning" Division was almost totally inexperienced when the Germans came to call, having been in France for less than one month. One regiment had been involved in the fight in the Hurtgen Forest and the division was on the left flank of the attack towards the Ryr and Urft dams when the Germans struck. The division stayed on the north shoulder of the "bulge" and helped keep the 272nd Volksgrenadier Division tied down, thus denying the Germans the use of this division in their offensive.
