Although a high numbered division the "Tough Hombres" Division had been well blooded as one of its regiments had stormed ashore at Utah Beach attached to the 4th Infantry. This division was already engaged in Patton's Saar offensive to the south when the call came to help contain the Germans in the Bulge. The 90th was rushed north and was heavily involved in the American counteroffensive to erase the Bulge.

The maintenance section of the 90th was known for its acquisition, evaluation, and issuance of captured weapons. The 105mm guns in the cannon companies in each regiment were replaced by German 120mm mortars the previous summer. General Patton refers to their use of these guns in his book "War as I Knew It"
