The 29th Indian Brigade was part of the 5th Indian Infantry Division but was temporarily detached and under control of the British 7th Armored Division. Stationed as a backup to the 7th Armored position, the brigade was called in to counterattack the Axis thrust in early June. Though suffering casualties, the brigade escaped east to fight another day.
