





Stuetzpunkt Capuzzo



The Italians once again defended Fort Capuzzo with a reinforced infantry company.


Stuetzpunkt Musaid



This strongpoint was halfway between Fort Capuzzo and Sollum and was defended by a reinforced infantry company.



Stuetzpunkt Ober Sollum




Strongpoint Upper Sollum was defended by another reinforced Italian Infantry company.






Mobile Infantry Reserve




