The 21st Panzer Division was heavily involved in the fight at El Alamein. After two weeks of intense fighting, the division had only four tanks left. The 21st fought a series of rearguard actions on the retreat back to Tunisia, eventually ceasing to exist as a divisional formation. The 21st Panzer ended the war in Tunisia fighting as scattered battlegroups.
