this adventure!**



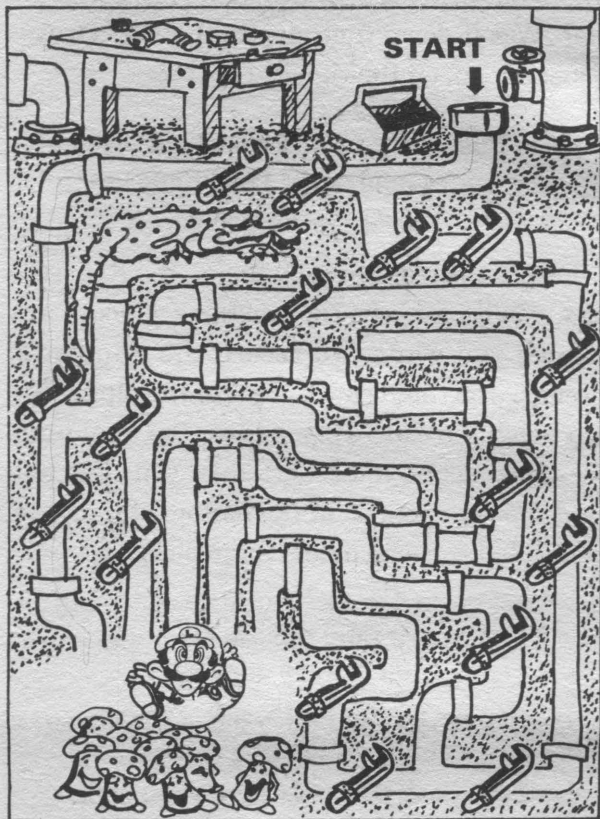

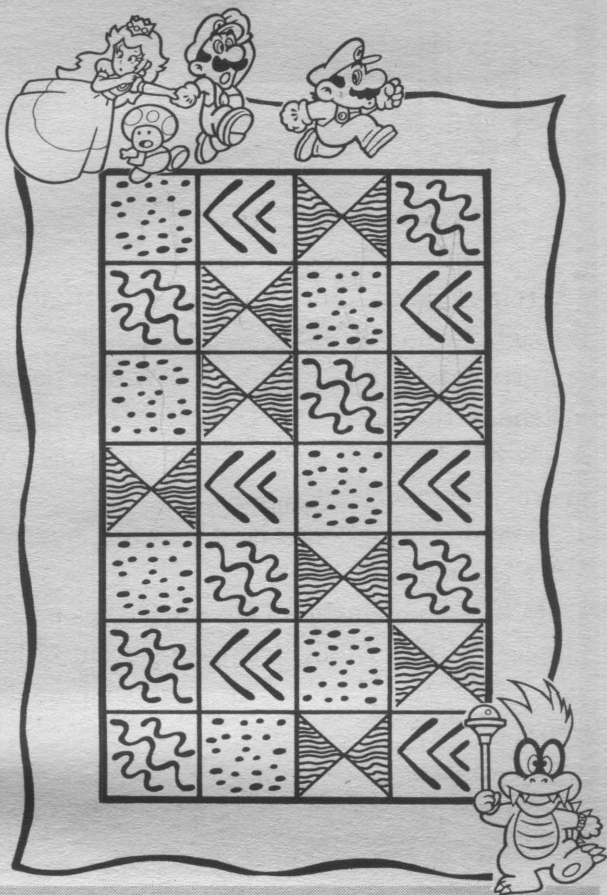
my date book, the next Mushroom Games are in three weeks!" she announces.

"Too bad," replies the penguin. "Organize your teams now."

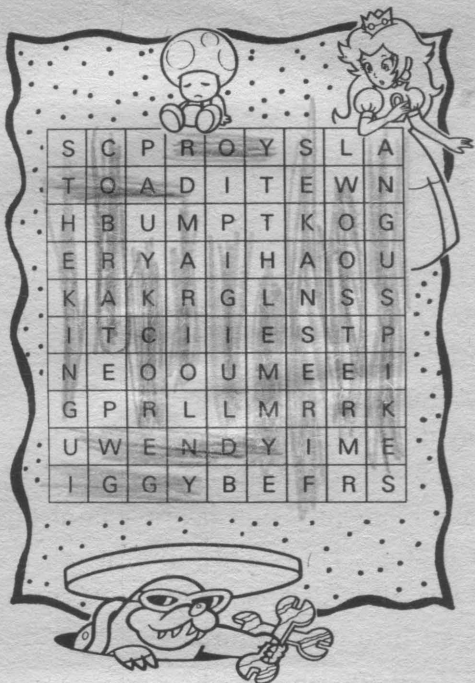

“We’ve just got to win!” sobs Wooster, as the

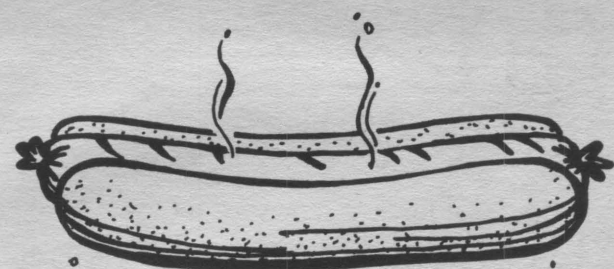
day of the games draws near. “If we don’t, the palace will be ruined!”

But there’s no sign of Wooster. Even more troubling, there’s no sign of the king. Instead,

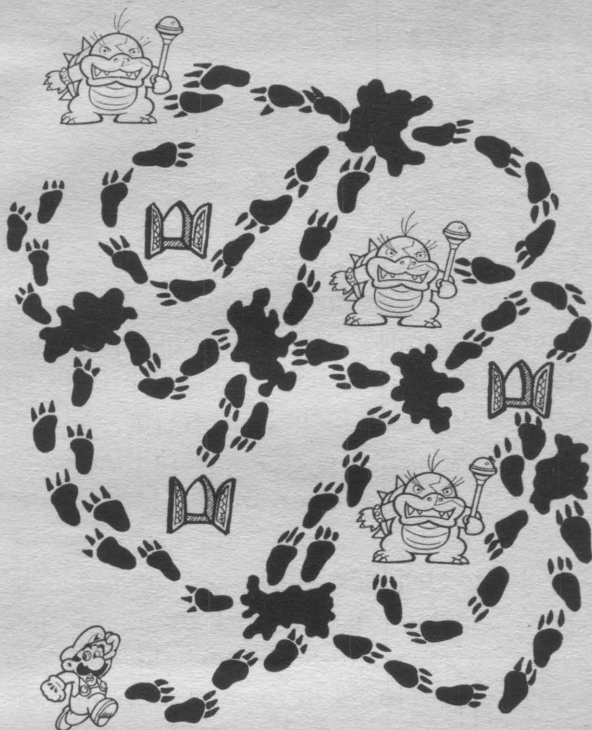

“Brilliant!” declares Mario.

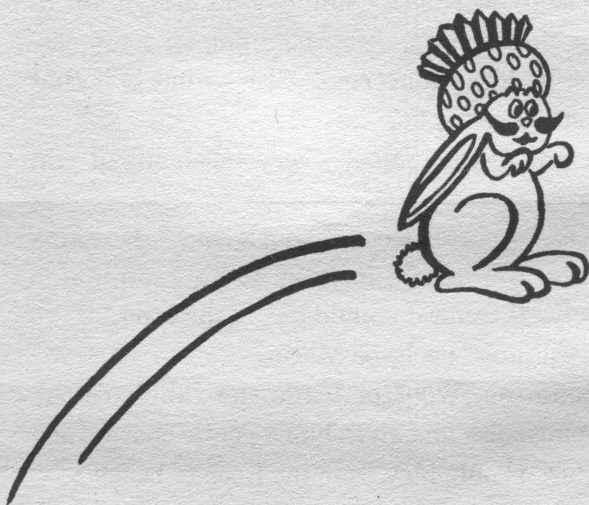

"I was in the garage, trying to untangle the royal air hoses," moans Wooster. "While I was gone, that horrible turtle zapped the king with a magic wand."

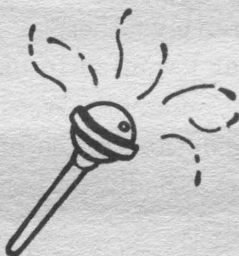
"Achoo!" Mario sneezes. "I'm allergic to rabbit fur."

al tunnels that lead out of the room. Before he reaches the tunnel entrance, he stumbles over a metal hatch in the floor.

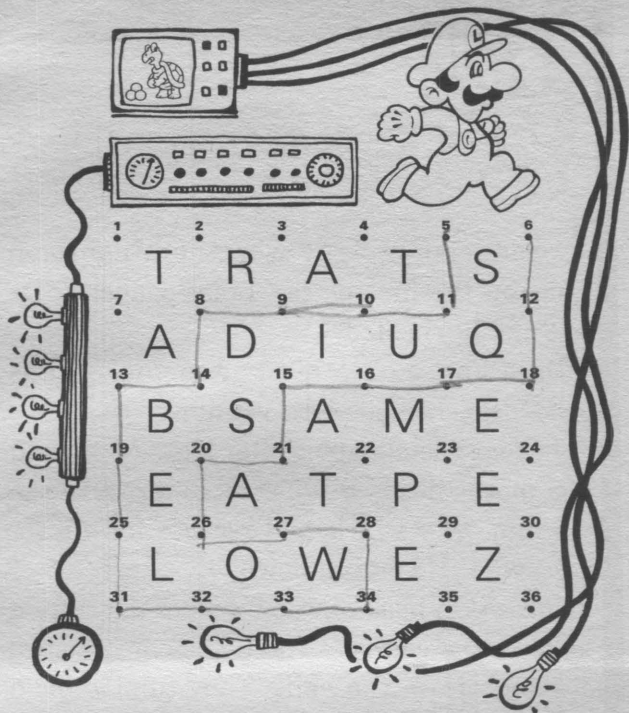

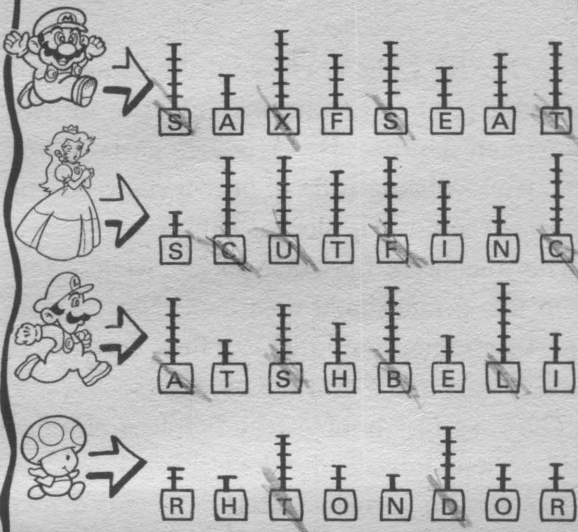

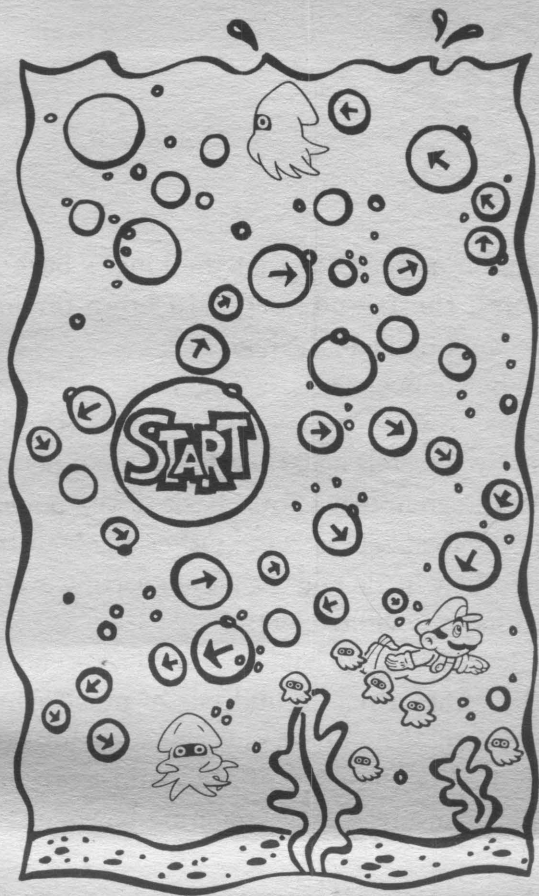

“Come back here!” Luigi yells. He darts after the turtle.

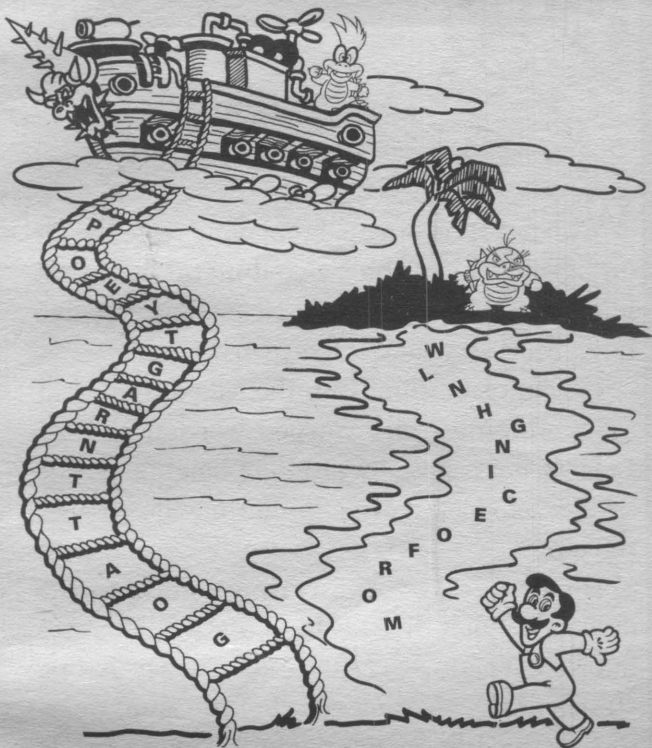

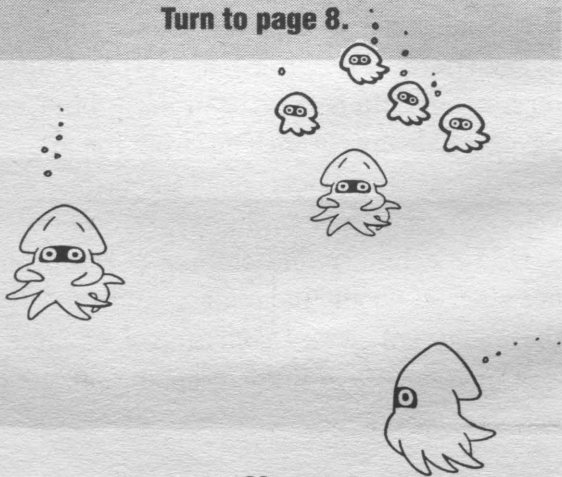
The others follow him through the echoing corridors, peeking through several glass port-holes as they go. Outside, strange sea creatures swim past, paying no attention to them at all.

"Rocky Wrench will run for the Sneaks," says Feldspar. A big rodent carrying a toolbox hops by the Royals' bench.

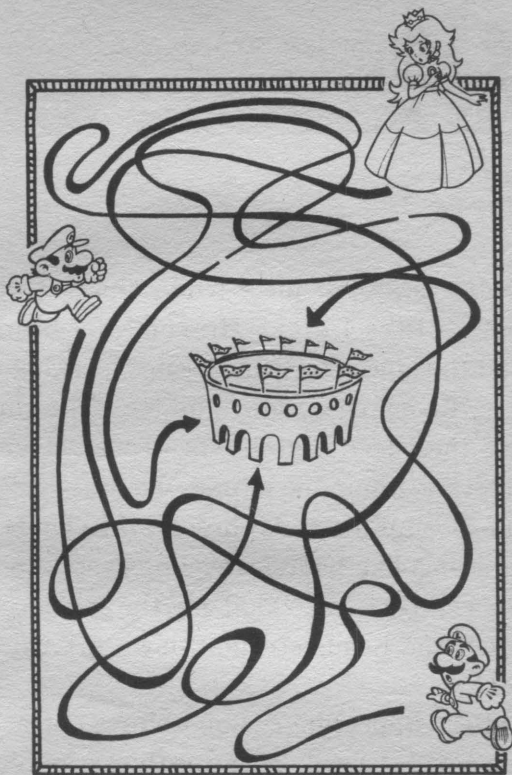
The princess wrinkles her nose. "That handbag does not go with that outfit," she says.

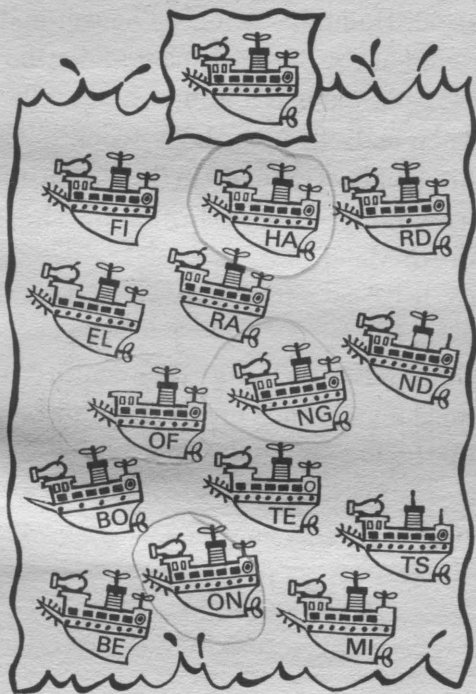

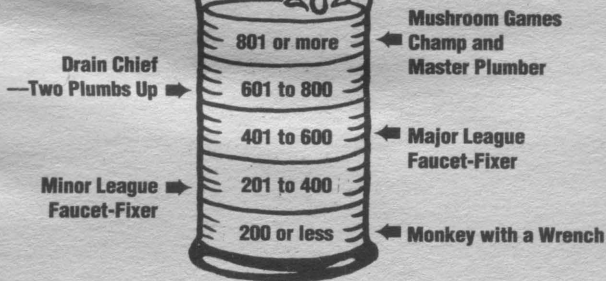

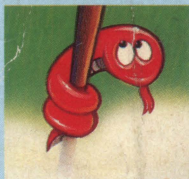
